

Lost Chord UK Safeguarding Policy

Protecting Children and Vulnerable Adults in Interactive Music Sessions

1. Introduction

Lost Chord UK (LCUK) is committed to safeguarding all individuals we work with, ensuring that our interactive music sessions provide a safe, inclusive, and uplifting experience for vulnerable adults, children, staff, musicians, and volunteers.

Our safeguarding commitment includes:

- **Creating a safe environment** where people feel respected, valued, and protected.
- Preventing abuse and harm in all our activities.
- Responding to safeguarding concerns promptly and appropriately.

This policy applies to:

- All Lost Chord UK staff, musicians, trustees, and volunteers.
- Subcontractors, charity partners, and any individuals or organisations working on our behalf.

2. Legal Framework

Lost Chord UK's safeguarding policy aligns with relevant UK legislation and best practices, including:

- **Children Act (1989, 2004)** Safeguarding children's welfare.
- No Secrets (2000)
- Care Act (2014) Protecting vulnerable adults.
- The Crime and Disorder Act (1998)
- The Health and Social Care Act (2008)
- **Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act (2006)** Regulating those working with at-risk individuals.
- The Children and Social Work Act (2017)

- Working Together to Safeguard Children (2018) Government guidance for safeguarding partnerships.
- **Mental Capacity Act (2005)** Supporting decision-making for individuals who may lack capacity.
- **Charity Commission Safeguarding Guidance** Ensuring best practices within charities.

The legislation and guidance relevant to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children.

3. Definitions

Safeguarding means protecting the health, wellbeing, and human rights of children and vulnerable adults, enabling them to live free from harm, exploitation, abuse, and neglect.

A **child** is defined as **anyone under the age of 18**.

A vulnerable adult is anyone aged 18 or over who:

- **Requires care and support** due to a mental or physical disability, age, illness, or other condition.
- May be unable to protect themselves from significant harm or exploitation.

This definition includes individuals living with **dementia**, **neurological conditions**, **mental health issues**, **physical disabilities**, or those who rely on **care services**.

4. Safeguarding Principles

LCUK is committed to:

- 1. Zero Tolerance for Abuse or Exploitation
 - We do not tolerate any form of abuse, neglect, or harm toward vulnerable adults or children.

2. Creating a Safe Environment

• All music sessions, performances, and events are **person- centred**, **inclusive**, **and designed to protect all participants**.

3. Recruitment & Training

- All staff, musicians, and volunteers undergo enhanced DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) checks.
- **Mandatory safeguarding training** ensures all team members understand their responsibilities.

4. Empowering Individuals

• We actively promote **choice**, **dignity**, **and respect** for all participants.

5. Confidentiality & Data Protection

 All safeguarding concerns are handled confidentially, in line with GDPR regulations.

5. Responsibilities

Board of Trustees

- **Overall responsibility** for safeguarding governance.
- Ensuring this policy is **reviewed annually** and remains effective.

Safeguarding Lead (CEO)

- Acts as Lost Chord UK's Designated Safeguarding Officer (DSO).
- Oversees the implementation of safeguarding policies and procedures.
- Ensures all safeguarding concerns are **properly managed and reported**.

Musicians, Volunteers & Staff

- Must **report any safeguarding concerns** immediately.
- Must follow safeguarding procedures during all interactions.
- Should act with **respect, compassion, and professionalism** at all times.

Partner Organisations

- All community care or charity partners must demonstrate their own safeguarding policies before working with LCUK.
- Partners must report safeguarding concerns related to LCUK activities.

6. Recognising & Responding to Safeguarding Concerns

A safeguarding concern may involve:

- **Physical abuse** (hitting, rough handling, inappropriate restraint).
- **Emotional abuse** (humiliation, threats, isolation).
- **Sexual abuse** (inappropriate touching, coercion, exploitation).
- **Neglect** (failure to provide adequate care or support).
- Financial abuse (fraud, coercion, misuse of finances).

What to Do If You Have a Concern

- 1. **Prioritise Safety** Ensure the individual is in a safe environment.
- 2. **Listen & Reassure** Stay calm, listen carefully, and avoid making assumptions.
- 3. **Record the Concern** Document key details (dates, times, people involved).
- 4. **Report the Concern** Contact the **Lost Chord UK Safeguarding Lead** within **24 hours**.

7. Reporting Procedures

All safeguarding concerns must be reported as follows:

Situation	Action
Immediate danger or risk	Call 999 and seek emergency help
Concern about abuse (non- urgent)	Report to Lost Chord UK Safeguarding Lead
Concerns about an LCUK staff member, musician, or volunteer	Report to Safeguarding Lead , who may escalate to the Board
If not satisfied with LCUK's response	Contact the Chair of Trustees or an external statutory body (e.g., Social Services, NSPCC, CQC, or Police)

Confidentiality & Information Sharing

- Reports will be handled with strict confidentiality.
- Information will only be shared with relevant agencies if necessary to **protect the individual**.

8. Preventative Safeguarding Measures

Recruitment & Vetting

- Enhanced **DBS checks** for all musicians, staff, and volunteers.
- **References checked** for all new hires and volunteers.
- Mandatory safeguarding **induction training** for new team members.

Ongoing Training

- Regular safeguarding refreshers for all personnel.
- Access to external safeguarding specialists for support.

Event & Session Safety

- Risk assessments conducted for all interactive music sessions.
- Clear procedures for handling disclosures during events.

9. Safeguarding Review & Compliance

- This policy is **reviewed annually** by the LCUK Board of Trustees.
- Safeguarding practices are **monitored through regular audits, incident reports, and feedback**.

Lost Chord UK encourages a culture of openness and accountability where everyone plays a role in keeping vulnerable adults and children safe.
